Problem	Actions Recommended	Actions to avoid
Amado waterkey stuck closed	Oil all access points, wait 1 hour, manipulate by hand	Mallets or hammers
Amado waterkey stuck open	Oil all access points, wait 1 hour, push/tap piston closed with pen/mallet	Direct hits with mallets + screwdriver
Bell or part is buckled over	Nothing	Bending it back (creates tears)
Instrument doesn't play	 Inspection: Valves in the wrong order? Valve(s) in backwards? Valve guide(s) installed backwards? Yamaha large brass: Valve guide installed correctly on the piston (vent hole vs. valve guide pin hole)? Obstruction? 	
Mouthpiece shank dented	Mouthpiece truing tool	 Pliers and mallets Flaring the shank end
Mouthpiece shank flared	Take to repair shop	Pliers and vises
